








# Welcome Message



# **CAFPNA 2022 Annual Meeting**

## Meeting Summary



The 2022 annual meeting of the Chinese Association for Food Protection in North America (CAFPNA) was held in Pittsburgh on Aug 1st. We had around 60 members participating in the meeting this year. It was the first time we got to meet all members in person since COVID-19.

IAFP executive board President-Elect Dr. Ruth Petran again joined our meeting and delivered a charging remark at the end of the meeting and encouraged the members to continue their active participation in CAFPNA in future.

Our then-president, Dr. Haiping Li, opened the meeting with a presentation of annual activity briefs from 2020 to 2021. She communicated the three goals of this affiliate: 1) Build a community to inspire and support each other to pursue excellence in Food Safety; 2) Help students and young professionals grow to be the front runners; 3) Be a Chinese cultural ambassador to serve the global food safety initiative.

After that, a summary of the student's program was then presented by Biyu Wu (University of Hawaii) on behalf of Ivy Li (McGill University). Student activities have been boosted by a strong lead from Ivy and the active involvement of the student committee members Biyu and Marti. They helped with the continued success of the mentor and mentee program, CAFPNA newsletter, website update and detailed preparation of our annual meeting, especially for the student competition. More students are welcome to join our student committee and activities.

the Finally, we announced Student Research Presentation Awards. competition was judged by the CAFPNA board members. The First Place Winner is Yaqi Zhao, a Ph.D. student from the Food Department of Florida State University, her title is Application of Novel Non-thermal Processing Technologies in Seafood Protein Analysis; the Second Place is Kaidi Wang, a Ph.D. candidate from the Food Science Department at McGill University, and her title is Rapid Identification of Foodborne Bacteria Using Single-cell Raman Spectroscopic Analysis Combined with Generative Adversarial Network; the third place is Dr. Xingyi Jiang, postdoctoral scholar from Department of Nutrition and Food Science at Florida State University, with a title as Immunodetection of Finfish in a non-finfish Products. ## **Food Safety Heroes**



Dr. Ruiqing Pamboukian
Food Safety Regulatory Scientist and Program
Lead, US Food and Drug Administration (FDA)

Dr. Pamboukian is a Food Safety Regulatory Scientist and Program Lead at the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA), Office of Regulatory Affairs, Office of Regulatory Science.

Her leadership includes developing and leading the FDA/State laboratory accreditation program to promote laboratory ISO 17025 accreditation for state regulatory food/feed testing laboratories and leading the FDA-funded Laboratory Flexible Funding (LFFM) Program to enhance the analytical capability/capacity of national food/feed testing laboratories. Her work contributed to building an Integrated Food Safety System (IFSS) throughout the nation in response to public health emergency/outbreaks involving with food supply.

Dr. Pamboukian is a US Public Health Service, Commissioned Corps officer in active duty, serving in the front lines of public health in the country. Beside her FDA work, she played several leadership roles in multiple committees within the corps and the AAPI community. She is the Chair of Chapter Committee of Federal Asian Pacific Council (FAPAC) and serves as Vice president of FDA FAPAC Chapter.

In 2010 she joined FDA and prior to her work in FDA, she was a research scientist at NIH and she received her PhD degree in Biochemistry and Molecular Biology from University of Maryland in 2006.



### Dr. Zuoxing (Zachary) Zheng, Senior Director, Fermentation, Nucelis, San Diego, CA

currently Dr. Zachary Zheng is Senior Director, Fermentation at Nucelis, a subsidiary of Cibus in San Diego, California. His primary responsibility is leading a fermentation function at Nucelis to provide technical and strategic guidance in supporting business development, microbial strain improvement, fermentation optimization, up and production of various scaling metabolites for food, cosmetics, pharmaceutical and agricultural applications.

Before joining Nucelis in September 2022, Dr. Zheng briefly worked at Nature's Fynd in Chicago as the Head of Pilot Operations leading fermentation pilot plant building and operations. Prior to working at Nature's Fynd, Dr. Zheng was Manager of Microbiology and Fermentation Research at Valent BioSciences in Libertyville, IL during 2014-2022 where he led a research team to develop fermentation based microbial metabolites for agricultural and public health applications. Prior to that, he had worked at Kraft Foods in 1999-2014 as a scientist where he developed numerous natural preservation technologies to improve food safety, quality and shelf life. Before coming to the U.S., he was Assistant Professor in the Department of Biological Sciences and Biotechnology at Tsinghua University in Beijing from 1988 to 1995. He was also a visiting scholar at Osaka University in Japan in 1992-1993.

Dr. Zheng received his B.S. and M.S. degrees in Fermentation Engineering and Microbiology in China and Japan, and Ph.D. degree in Food Science from the University of Massachusetts-Amherst. In his three decades of professional life in both academia and industry, Dr. Zheng has published dozens of papers, patents, and book chapters. He has served on the editorial board of Food Biotechnology and reviewer for several scientific journals. He has received numerous awards from industry, academia, and professional organizations.

Dr. Zheng has been an active member of IFT (Institute of Food Technologists), CAFPNA (Chinese Association for Food Protection in North America) and CAFS (Chinese American Food Society) where he has played several leadership roles at both regional and national levels. He had served as the Chair of Chicago Section IFT Tanner Lecture Committee in 2007-2014, Chair of IFT Foodservice Division in 2014-2015, President of CAFPNA in 2015-2016, President of CAFS in 2021-2022.

#### **Automatic Visa Revalidation**

Re-entering the United States with a Valid I-94 Form and Expired Visa.

Under the automatic revalidation provision of immigration law, certain temporary visitors holding expired nonimmigrant visas who seek to return to the U.S. may be admitted at a U.S. port-of-entry by CBP, if they meet certain requirements.
